A reference list **MUST** be included using the following information as a guide. Only *cited* text references are included. Each reference is referred to in the text by a number enclosed in a square bracket i.e (5). References **must be numbered and ordered according to where they are first mentioned in the paper**, NOT alphabetically. (11)

Journal Papers:

Note that the journal title, volume number and issue number are set in last.

Books:

Note that the title of the book is in lower case letters and italicized. There is no comma following the title. Place of publication and publisher are given.

Chapters in Books: (11)

3. Horal D. M. (2008). Philosophy and the science of subjective well-being. In M. Eid & R. J. Larsen (Eds.), *The science of subjective well-being* (pp. 17-43). New York, NY: Guilford Press.

Note that the place of publication, publisher, and year of publication are enclosed in brackets. Editor of book is listed before book title.

Note that thesis title is set in italics and the university that granted the degree is listed along with location information
